Dear Parents,

The Church recognizes May as the month of Mary, a time for special prayers and services honoring Mary. I think that the most beautiful devotion to Mary is the May Crowning tradition. Tomorrow, we celebrate the May Crowning as a school community. The May Crowning at St. Rocco School is one of the most beautiful and beloved programs



of the year for our community. It is a beautiful way that our school community has to show our love, respect and reverence for Mary our Mother during this month of May. Many of our current parents who are alumni can look back and remember how special it was for them as both a younger student as well as an 8th Grader. If you have never joined us for this special devotion to Mary, or if you have been with us each year, I strongly encourage you to join us tomorrow at 9:00 for this powerful service that honors Mary and unites us in prayer as a school community. All students should be in full dress uniform.

This past Saturday, our Second Grade class along with three other students received the Holy Sacrament of First Communion. We pray that the blessing of Almighty God be with each of them and that they may continue to be filled with the Love of Christ each time they receive Holy Communion. Our special thanks to Sr. Daisy, whose faith and guidance has blessed the First Communion class with enduring love for Jesus and a desire to follow Him.

This Sunday we celebrate Pentecost Sunday. Pentecost takes place on the 50th day after Easter Sunday. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon Mary, mother of Jesus and the Apostles of Jesus while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks. It marks the end of the Easter season in the liturgical year of the Church.

On a very different note...

When I started at St. Rocco School in the 2002-2003 school year, the beloved principal at the time, Sr. Mary Carol, would say over the PA each day after prayers and announcements: "Make it a great day or not, the choice is yours". My children were 7 and 9 at the time and were blessed to hear this each morning at school. They learned at a young age that they had a say in how they lived each day. It has gotten us through some very difficult times. The idea that you have the choice in how you respond to the events of a day that you often have no control over is reassuring and empowering.

It is so important to empower our children by letting them make mistakes and bounce back on their own. This builds both character and resilience and gives children at whatever age a realistic vision of life. Sometimes things go your way and sometimes they don't; but in either scenario, a person needs to get up and out of bed to face the new day. Teaching this will allow children to achieve and accomplish things on their own and build strong self-confidence. Similarly, expecting someone else, often a parent, to achieve for them will build reliance instead of independence in children. Please support the faculty and staff as we strive each day to shape strong, independent, resilient young people. It is May and the students know the requirements both in the classroom and out at recess. If your child does not do well on an assignment or assessment, please encourage them to put more effort in or study harder. If they misbehave or are unkind at recess and the teacher reaches out to you, please work with them

on making better choices and being accountable for their actions. Teaching children the life skills of independence, accountability and resilience from a young age will serve them well throughout their lives.

Special thanks to Mrs. Montecalvo, Miss Tripp, Mrs. Reitz and Mrs. Okolowitcz for chaperoning the semi-formal dance last Friday. Everyone who went had a wonderful time.

Special thanks, also, to Mrs. Bianco for arranging to have the Johnston Fire Department come tomorrow with a fire truck for our Early Childhood classes. They are really looking forward to it.

A Few Reminders:


