A Note from the Principal...

Dear Parents,

Two of the most important things that we can do as parents and educators is to assist our children in developing resilience and accepting responsibility. Resilience is defined as the capacity to recover quickly from difficulties. It is the ability to bounce back from setbacks, difficulties, or disappointments. It's the strength to withstand adversity and grow despite life's challenges. In essence, resilience refers to a certain inner "toughness".

However, each time we let a child pick themselves up, dust themselves off and keep going, the seeds of resilience and responsibility within them grow bigger and stronger.

on our multiplication tables. In science we are learning about living things as well as classifying animals. We are


looking forward to learning about ecosystems and doing a project on living and nonliving things in ecosystems.
