Dear Parents,

This year Ash Wednesday falls on February 14TH, Valentine's Day. This is only the third time this has happened since 1945. This is such an important day in the liturgical year that here at St. Rocco's our focus will be on Ash



Wednesday and not Valentine's Day. Valentine celebrations will take place prior to the 14th. On Ash Wednesday, we will go to Mass at 9:00am and receive ashes as a school community. We will focus on the importance of Ash Wednesday and how it is the beginning of Lent, a time for prayer, fasting and almsgiving. These three practices are highlighted on Ash Wednesday and encouraged throughout the days of Lent. For this to happen with our children, they need to go to Mass. They also need us as adults to talk about and model these three Lenten practices. Discussing with your children the significance of praying, fasting and almsgiving and helping them to find meaningful ways to embrace these practices will help

to make this season a time for change in their spiritual lives. I hope that your family finds time in the next week to prepare for the season of Lent. It can be a time of reflection and growth for all ages.

NEASC Reaccreditation ...

St. Rocco School has begun the process of self-study that will lead to our reaccreditation next spring. Reaccreditation is on a ten-year cycle. During our professional development day in October, a member from the New England Association of Schools and Colleges presented an overview to the faculty and staff on the reaccreditation process. The 2025 Self-Study will follow a very different format than the last time we were reaccredited back in 2015. The new process has two parts. The first part is the "Foundation Visit" which will take place in the fall of 2024. The second part is the "Program Visit" that will take place in the spring of 2025. We will be giving regular updates as we progress through the self-study. In the next few weeks, you will receive a survey that will help us in this process. Your input is so very important. Please keep us in your prayers as we strive to do our best for St. Rocco School.

CLASSROOM NEWS... Prck A

It is amazing to me how fast a school year goes by; we have already completed over one hundred days of the 2023-2024 school year. The students in Pre-K 4 are growing and learning every day.

We are continuing our journey through the alphabet. We are already working on the letter R; we will make a rhino and a racoon to help us learn the letter sound! We are working on our number skills recognizing the numerals up to twenty and putting them in order. We will begin to use whiteboards to draw shapes, write numerals and number words as well as color words and upper and lowercase letters. We are learning about the various parts of a book.

We are learning to identify the front cover, the back cover, the spine or binding, the title and that the author writes the words, and the illustrator draws the pictures. The pre-k students are working hard on their cutting skills. The children are often at the writing center cutting paper and gluing it together to make pictures and books.

The students are continuing to get ready for kindergarten. We have been working on rhyming words, sequencing events in a story and measuring. We will begin to learn about space

and the planets after February vacation, the students enjoy bringing our classroom to life with the planets. After April vacation we will learn about butterflies, the weather, the different seasons, and plants. We will watch caterpillars grow into butterflies and

release them into the trees. We will also plant our own flowers and enjoy watching them grow.

Before you know it, we will be planning our end of the year activities, and it will be time for the children to move on to kindergarten. The year always goes by so quickly.



CLASSROOM NEWS... Prek B

Happy February from Pre-K4B!

We are looking forward to our upcoming Valentine's celebration both in class and with our families in Cafe Rocco.

These past few weeks have been very fun. Our thematic unit lessons have included: States of Matter, Polar Animals, Winter Weather, Holidays Around the World, and Helping Hands. We have enjoyed theme related show & tell as well as some fun seasonal art projects.

Each day begins with a Morning Meeting that promotes collaboration and community through shared stories and activities. We have almost made it through the entire alphabet during meeting time. We are working hard on letter sound and formation along with writing both capital & lowercase. We have also started working with sight words. The class can consistently recognize 4 sight words!

Our Heggerty Phonemic Awareness Curriculum also takes place during morning meetings. The Heggerty program shows the connection between letters and the sounds they make. The children are currently on week 18 of the lessons. We have been working on rhyming words, blending, segmenting, middle sounds, and initial sounds. The kids are fantastic with the repetition and related hand motions. If you see a friend from Pre-K4B, ask them to show you what a "roller coaster word" is. It helps with those tricky vowel sounds!



In our Math lessons, we have been patterning, solving simple equations, & working on writing and recognizing our numbers. The kids have been creating their own patterns throughout the day independently.



During Religion, the children are growing in awareness and understanding of Jesus' mission & love for us. They have also become active members in celebrating the Mass with our St. Rocco School family.

Encouraging kindness, self-confidence, respect, and empathy continues to be our daily goals in class.

I am excited to watch these students continue to grow and develop for the rest of our time together in Pre-Kindergarten.
