**IF YOUR CHILD IS NOT FEELING WELL, please keep them home and call or email the SCHOOL OFFICE FIRST to report them absent. You may send an email to your child's teacher and to the nurse, but initially, the phone call/email must be to the School Office first. Please DO NOT send a notification of absence through

Class Dojo. If you are unsure if you should send your child to school, call the office to speak to the nurse. Please contact the Nurse with any questions.

Please call to notify the School Office by 8:30AM if your child will be absent. If your child is going to be late and will be ordering school lunch, please call the School Office no later than 8:30AM so we can plan accordingly. PLEASE DO NOT NOTIFY THE TEACHER THROUGH CLASS DOJO IF YOUR CHILD IS SICK.

<u>Student Data/Custody Concerns</u> – Please notify the School Office if any information regarding your child has changed since the submission of your child's application for enrollment. Any custody concerns require immediate notification to the School Office.

DRESS CODE: – We take pride in the appearance of our students. The way a student dresses and appears often influences behavior and learning. Uniforms must be worn at all times unless it is a casual "Dress Down Day". Please refer to the School Handbook available on the School Website.

<u>DRESS DOWN DAY POLICY/MONTHLY PASSES</u> ~ Each month throughout the school year, beginning in October, St. Rocco School will be offering special dress down passes for the month. You may purchase the monthly passes for November for the cost of \$5.00. The "Dress Down Day" passes are for **Tuesdays only**. Please place the money in a clearly labeled envelope with the required form, your child's name and grade, along with your payment. (Checks ONLY). Hello from 1st grade!

We have been so busy these first 2 months of school. We are settled into our new routine and are loving being big 1st graders!

Each day we are becoming more and more independent with our writing! We have been working hard on sounding out words and remembering all our rules when writing a sentence.

In reading, we are working on reading and spelling short vowel words. This week, we are working with the short u sound. Each week we read 2 stories in our reading textbooks. We love being able to read stories all on our own!

Even though we love being able to read on our own now, one of our favorite parts of the day is when Miss Messier reads us a story using Novel Effect.
