Important Reminders...

We are halfway through the first trimester. Please continue to monitor your child's progress on their Plus Portal account. The Portal is also used by teachers to share information and is a good place to stay up to date. If you need assistance in accessing your child's account, please call the office.

Please call the office if your child is going to be out. The procedure for absences is outlined in the Student Handbook. The office should always receive the first call.

Students can only be released to adults who are listed in their paperwork. Please send a note into the office if there is a change in who will be picking up your child. Additional adults can be added to your records by calling the office. The staff will ask to see a driver's license when they do not know the person picking up.

While the number of tardy students each day has been low, the goal is for all students to be in the building by 8:10 and in their classroom ready for prayers and announcement by 8:15. Over the next week, I will be contacting those families who have a student who has been late several times this year.

Arrival and Dismissal...

Please do not block the Atwood Avenue entrance to the church driveway, the bus drop off area or any driveway that belongs to our neighbors. No cars should be parked in front of the school at dismissal while the driver gets out to pick up a child. Parking is available in the Convent parking lot, the Faculty and Staff parking lot and the Church parking lot at the back of the school. In addition, cars should move cautiously in all parking lots and no U-turns are permitted in the front of the school. Please drive as if every child in our school is your child.

The Pre- K 4 students have had a great start to a new school year. I am happy to have Miss Kathy and Sister Sheeba as my assistants. I am looking forward to collaborating closely with them this year. The Pre-School students have successfully transitioned into our new daily routine. They are managing to take off and put on their coats by themselves, unpack their backpacks and put all their possessions away. The children are working at the learning centers where they are learning to take turns, build strong structures, and write words.



The children have already begun their Alphabet program. This year we are making characters out of the letters, for letter "Aa" the class made an alien and an apple, then they practiced writing the letters all by themselves! We had RED day where they wrote the word "RED," then the students finger painted apples red and made a red handprint.

We have been very busy in Pre-K 4 B! Our class started these first few weeks at St. Rocco School knowing that they are loved and cared for, and that Jesus is always in their hearts. During the first two weeks of school, friends were excited to visit St. Rocco church and learn about some important parts of the church. We worked on praying in church and are actively working on learning our class prayers.

Our curriculum includes small and whole group learning activities. Our weekly thematic units for September were All About Me, Apples, 5 Senses, and Autumn. Our centers are based on our themes & weekly lessons and encourage our children to be cooperative playmates and independent students.



In literacy, we have been working on writing the letters of our names using both uppercase and lowercase letters. We have been working on our "Letter of the week" each week. We are up to the letter EI Along with Pre-K 4 A, we have been using the Heggerty Phonemic awareness curriculum during circle time. Pre-K ha been learning rhyming words, alliteration, segmenting sentences, and

syllables.

In science, we are exploring the steps of the scientific method by learning about apple oxidation and chemical reactions. In October, we will learn about the life cycle and parts of a pumpkin.



Our math lessons include counting on a given number, number recognition, and number writing practice. We love using unifix cubes for our math activities!

Our most important conversations in Pre-K prioritize kindness in our classroom. We call ourselves a "Pre-K family" and often discuss what kind words and actions are and how we can be helpful friends.
