# **Classroom News**

### Fourth Grade News... Mrs. Lisa Ciunci

Fourth grade has had a busy first couple of months at St. Rocco School. The students have settled in easily and are working hard. In English they have written personal narratives about a special memory. Topics have included a special basketball, football or soccer

game, a birthday party, an escape room, getting a new pet, riding a roller coaster, a hayride, a plane ride, picking out a cookie, a gymnastics meet and a dance competition! Students have learned how to concentrate on one small moment in time and make their reader feel like they were there using sensory details. These stories have helped us get to know one another and were so fun to share.

Our new reading book is both exciting and challenging. We are exploring the question, "how can a place affect how we live?" Students are reading various literary works including biographies, autobiographies, magazine articles and informational texts. They are learning to make predictions, use background

knowledge, make inferences, and analyze text structure. Students continue to expand their knowledge in science and social studies studying cells, plants, animals, habitats, maps, and geography. They have created their own islands and are currently learning all about Rhode Island.



In Math we are working hard daily on computation, estimation, counting money, making change, problem solving, and multiplication facts! We are using our Chromebooks to practice typing skills, math, and reading comprehension. Students have been using websites such as Typing Club, ReadWorks, Spelling Training and Boddle. We will also be working with Word and PowerPoint this year.

Religion lessons remind us to think before we act, and to treat others the way we want to be treated. We have learned that God reveals Himself through Jesus and he wants us to show love and concern for all the way Jesus did. Students have also learned that their faith will grow through prayer and that the saints pray for us every day.

Fourth grade is such an exciting year. These students are bright and creative. It is a blessing to watch them grow academically and spiritually.
