We have been having a fantastic year so far in ELA and Literature!


All classes have been working very hard on their grammar units. So far, we have covered nouns, pronouns, adjectives, verbs, and prepositions! This semester we will continue to focus on our writing skills. 6th grade finished writing about themes and will soon be creating their own dystopian worlds! 7th grade has been working very hard on their *The Outsiders* essays as 8th grade is passionately trying to prove that Napoleon is a tyrant in *Animal Farm*.



Students in sixth grade have just finished reading *The Watsons go to Birmingham* where we learned about the Civil Rights Movement and Birmingham, Alabama. We completed many different projects including making board games that represent the novel (see below!). We are now beginning *The Hunger Games* and are excited to learn about dystopian worlds as well as make connections with Greek Gods to the themes and characters within *The Hunger Games*.

Seventh grade just finished reading *The Outsiders* by S.E. Hinton and are in the middle of writing literature analysis essays. We loved getting to know the Curtis brothers and seeing how






