It is amazing to think that we are already halfway through the 2023-2024 school year. The Pre-k 3 class is growing by leaps and bounds. We come each day to learn and play and we make good friends the St. Rocco School way!

Every child can recognize their name and many of their classmates' names. Nearly all the children write their names in uppercase, and a few write their name in proper case. This is amazing for a three-year-old class.



The preschoolers are doing a fantastic job in math, as well. They are learning to form numerals 0-9. They understand one-to-one correspondence and they can make ABAB patterns. The children know the months of the year and the days of the week.

Our religion curriculum God Made Me is an exceptional program. We are currently on Unit 3 "God Made Me Happy". Our current chapter is titled "I Can Pray". They talk about prayers of thanks and praise. The children bless themselves and say grace before snacks and lunch. After hearing that morning and evening are good times for prayer, they will be making doorknob hangers as prayer reminders.

The children sit nicely for circle time every day and they raise their hands to be called on. The other classes often compliment the students on how nicely they walk in line.
