
SPRING PRODUCTION

Religion - Gr. 6-8 Mrs. Meg Reitz

We continue to make progress in Religion and Social Studies in grades 6-8.



In 6th grade Religion class, The Israelites have almost reached the Promised Land in our study of the Old Testament! We have followed Moses as he has led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt to their final destination, the "Land of milk and honey!" This has been a long, long journey for the Israelites with many lessons taught by God throughout their journey.

In **7th grade Religion**, we are continuing to learn about the life of Christ. We follow along in scripture and word and see how Jesus taught us through the parables. The lessons of Jesus are endless! We are striving to put our faith into action in all that we do.





In 8th grade Religion, we continue to study for the Sacrament of Confirmation in the fall. The students are learning and growing so much in their faith! It is wonderful to see!

Each child MUST be accompanied by an adult


